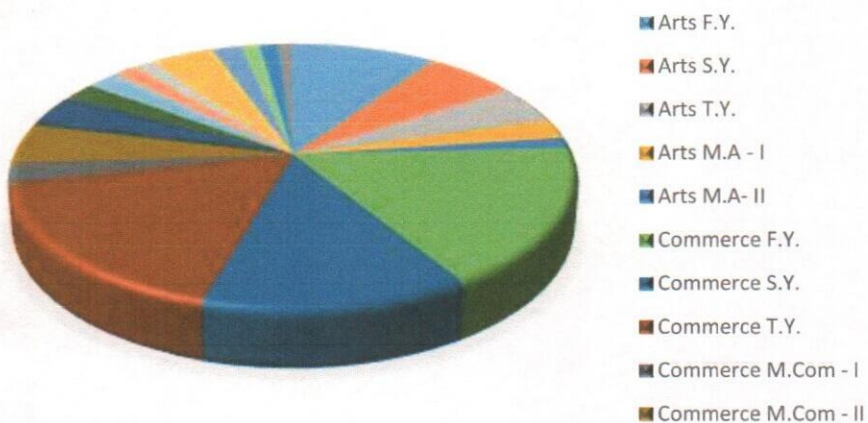

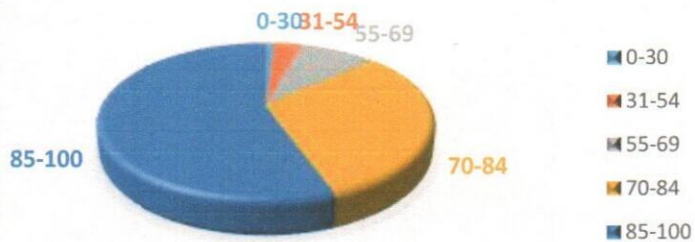

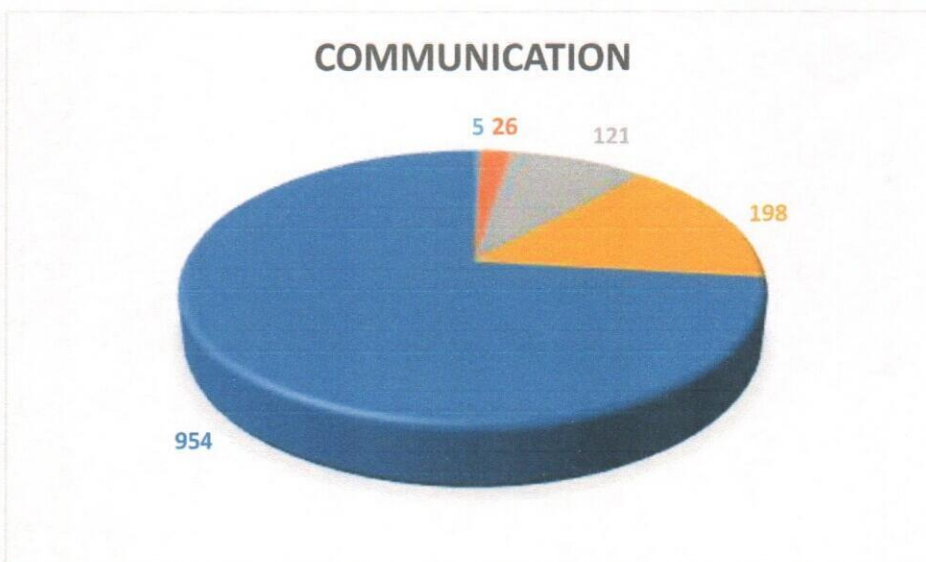

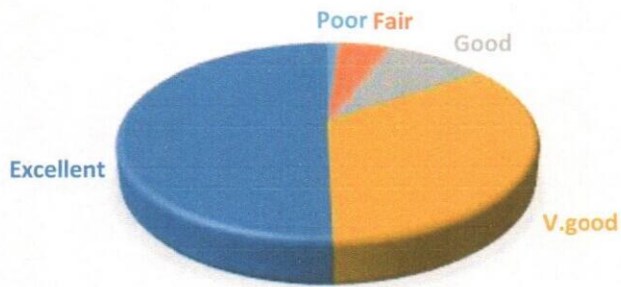

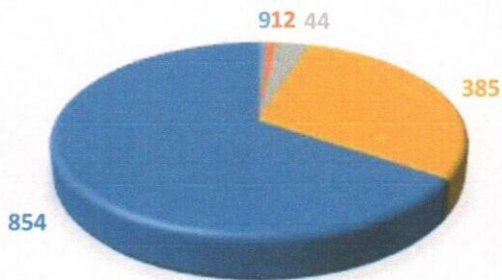

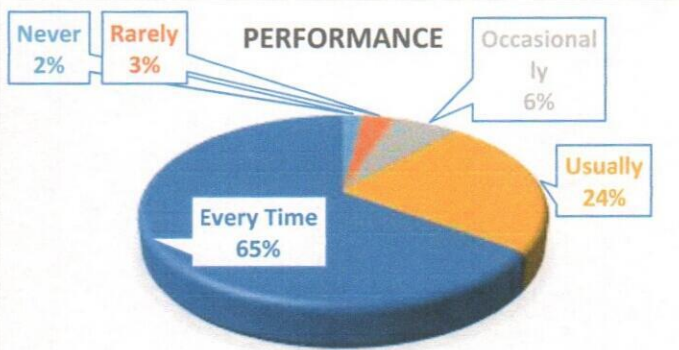

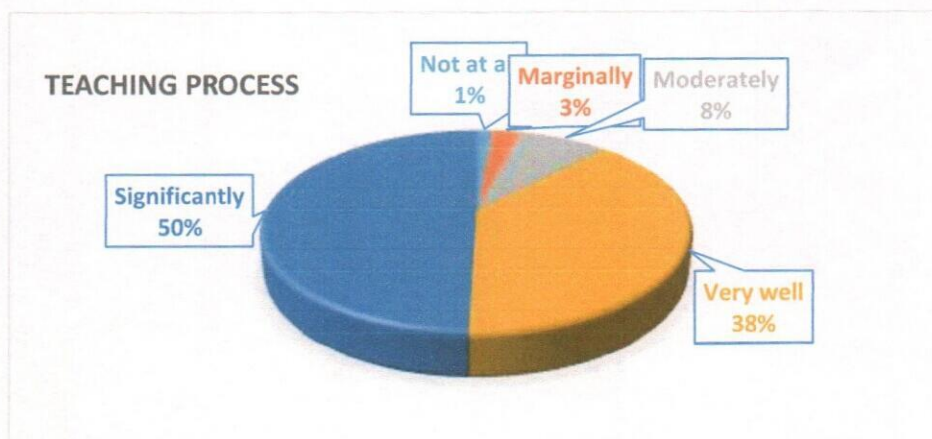

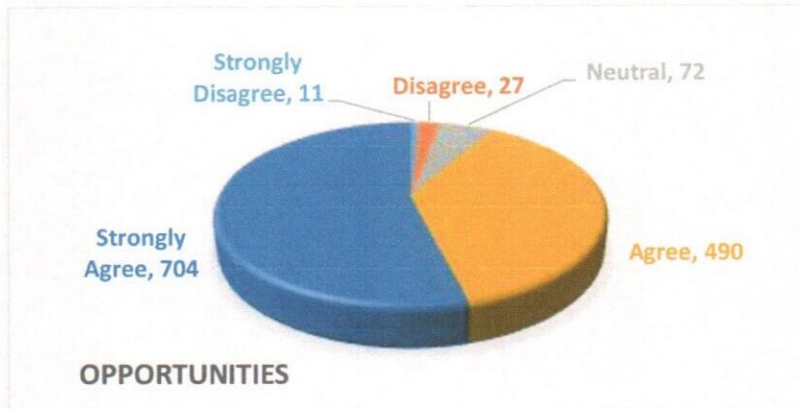

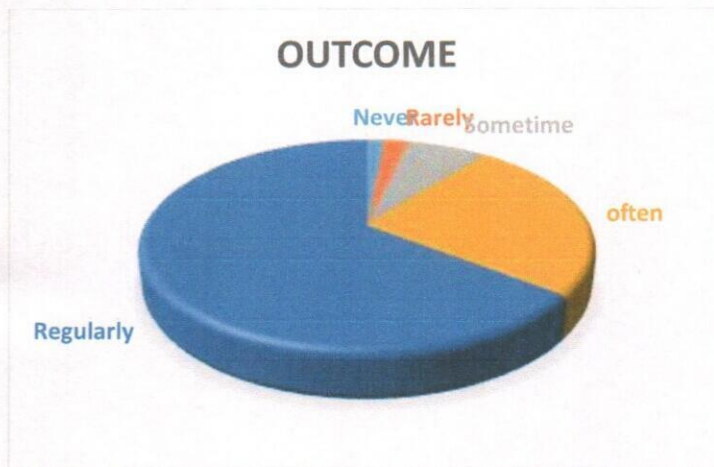

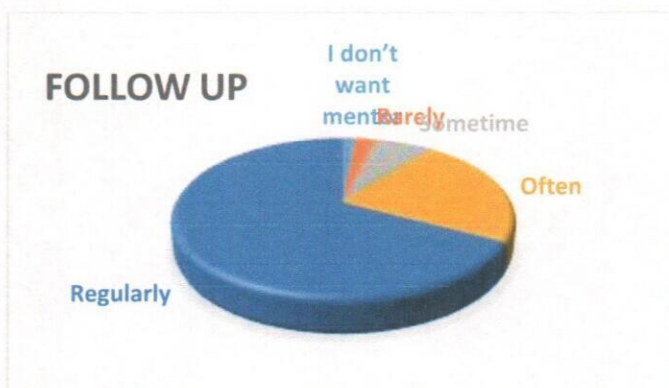

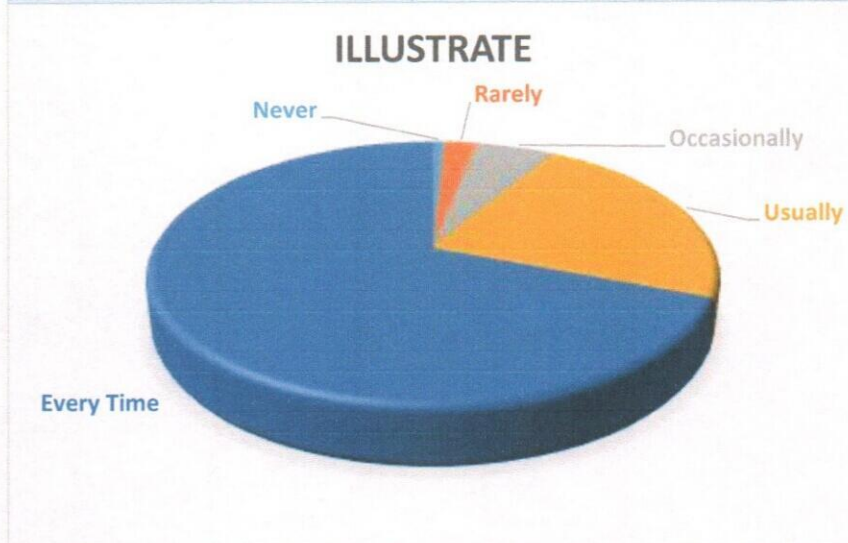

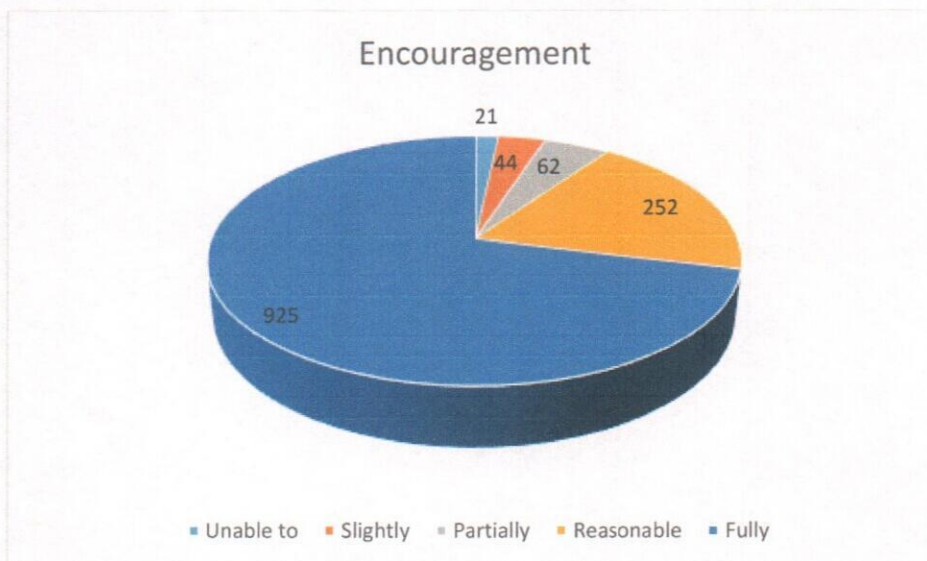

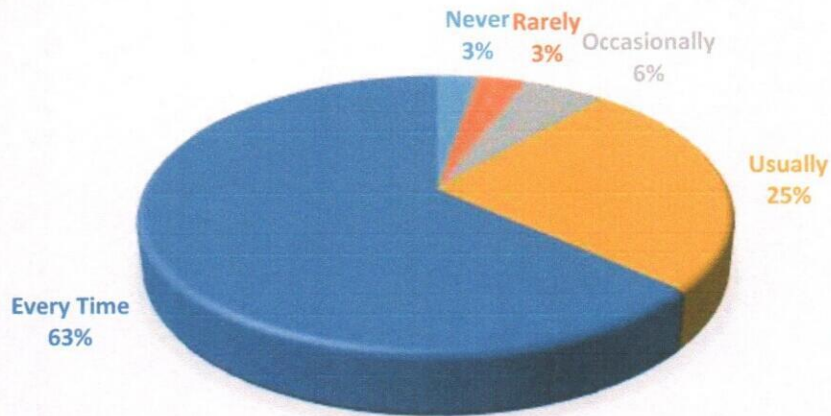

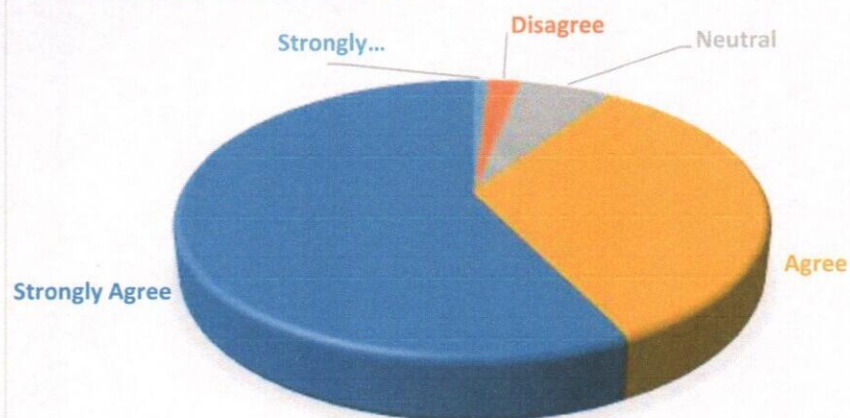

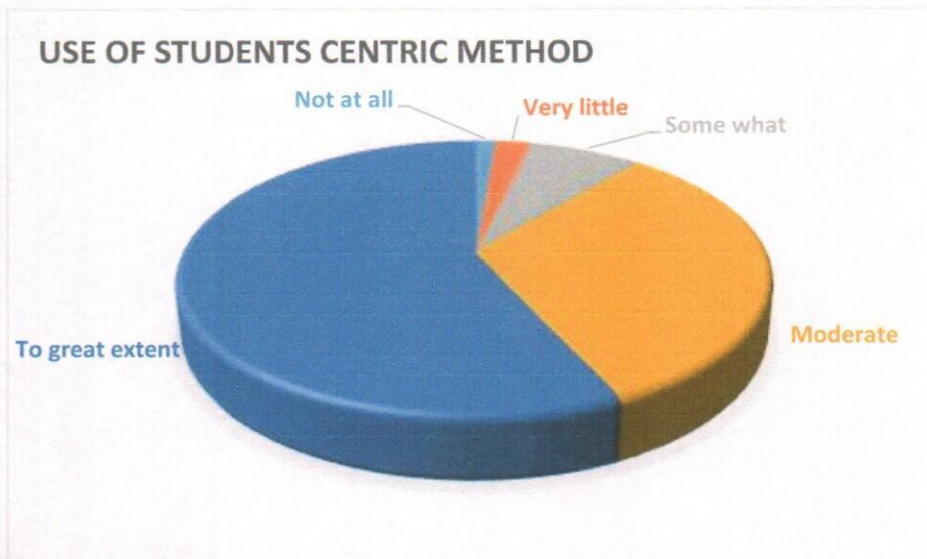

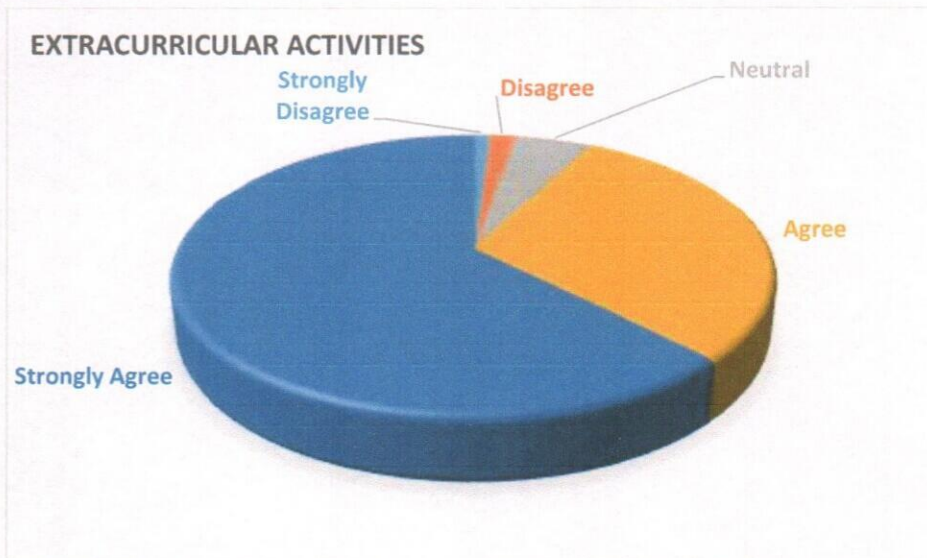

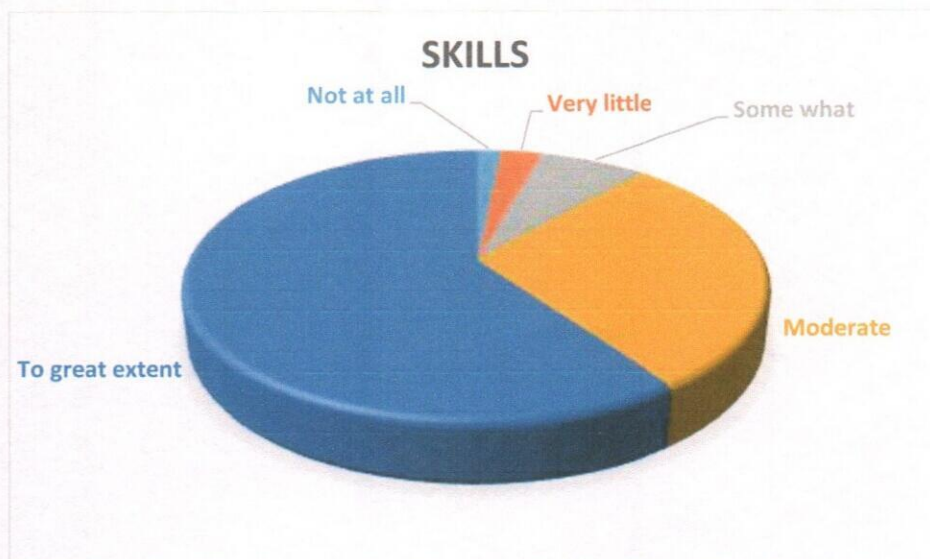
Q.17 Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities

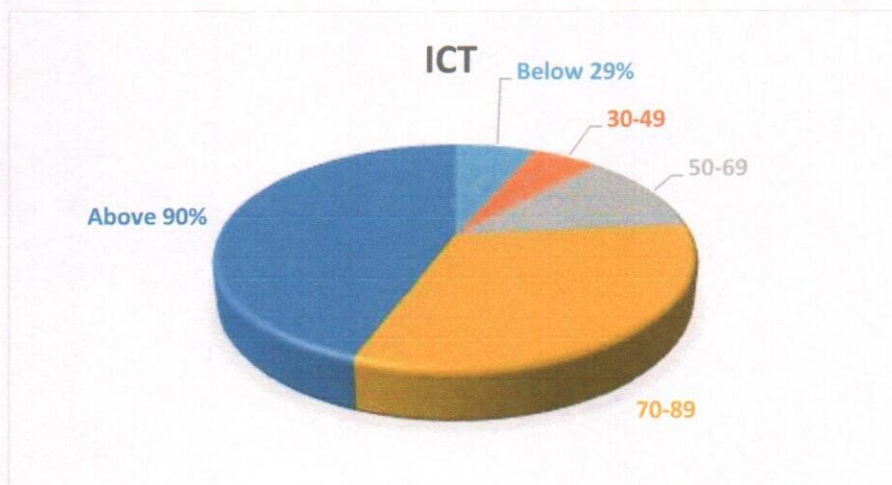

Q. 19 what percentage of teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, Multimedia, etc. while teaching.

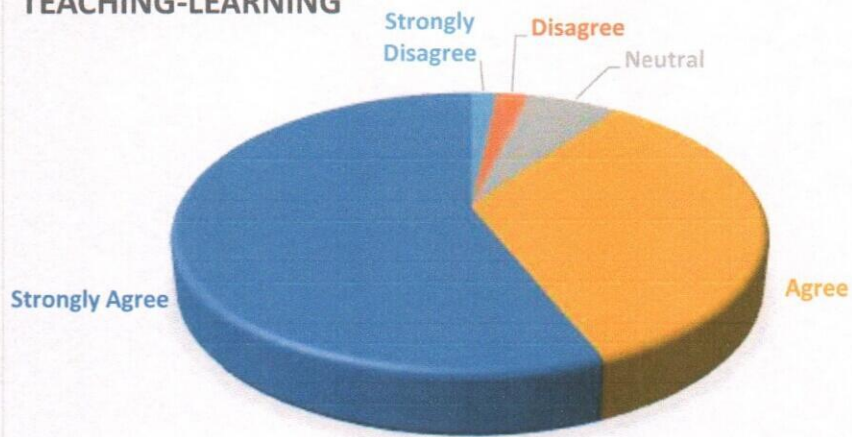
