Rayat Shikshan Sanstha, Satara

The Rayat Shikshan Sanstha, Satara is a renowned and the largest educational institutions in the Asian continent. Its founder, Karmaveer Bhaurao Patil, witnessed the plight of impoverished farmers and villagers who were deprived of education and knowledge for generations. To bring about a change in this situation, Mahatma Phule's teaching of education being the only path to transformation deeply resonated with him. Accordingly, he made the decision to take the initiative of providing education to students in rural areas, which was only available in a few cities in Maharashtra.

To spread the light of knowledge to every household, the Karmaveer Bhaurao Patil was inspired by the teachings of Mahatma Phule and Rajarshi Chhatrapati Shahu Maharaja. On 4th October 1919, he began a boarding school in Kale village in the Satara district, marking the beginning of the Rayat Shikshan Sanstha's journey.

They brought together children of all castes and religions in the society and imparted education to them to promote self-reliance and social awareness. The principles of education were based on equal opportunity, equality, brotherhood, humanity, self-reliance, and social awareness. Various branches of the institution were established based on these principles by Karmveer Bhaurao Patil, primarily in rural and tribal areas, so that education became easily accessible to all common people.

Through this tireless effort, the Rayat Shikshan Sanstha has transformed into a large organization with its roots firmly planted in the education sector. In 1994, the organization celebrated its Golden Jubilee, and now it is continuing its journey towards the Centenary celebrations. Today, the organization has expanded its reach to 15 districts of Maharashtra and runs over 670 branches, including 40 colleges, more than 400 high schools, junior colleges, and residential hostels. The Rayat Shikshan Sanstha continues to provide the gift of education to the people of Maharashtra.

In order to fulfil the educational needs of students in the industrial area of Pimpri-Chinchwad, the Rayat Shikshan Sanstha established the Mahatma Phule College in Waghere in 1983.

Mahatma Phule College:

Established in 1983 by the Rayat Shikshan Sanstha, Mahatma Phule College has completed its 31 years of progress. It has acknowledged the pace of educational progress and development in the industrial area of Pimpri-Chinchwad. The college is situated in a central location of the city near the PMPML bus stand, with new buildings and a playground added to the campus for expansion. The process of accreditation began ten years ago, and in the first five years, the college received a grade of "B+". Taking inspiration from this, with consistent hard work, the college received an "A" grade in the 2009-10 academic years. This achievement is a matter of great pride. Furthermore, getting admitted to an "A" grade college is a dream come true for students.

Features:

The college offers junior college courses (11th and 12^{th)} grade in Arts, Commerce (English and Marathi medium), and Science. It offers undergraduate courses B.A., B.Com. (English and Marathi medium), B.Sc., and postgraduate courses in Marathi, Hindi, Economics, History, M.A./M.Sc. Geography, M.Com./M.Sc. Chemistry, and B.C.A. From June 2012, the Yashwantrao Chavan Maharashtra Open University's B. Lib. and M. Lib. Courses have been started. The college's notable features include education, art, sports, culture, student-parent interactions, job placement cell, and mentor-mentee, which bring students and parents together.

Library:

A well-stocked and well-maintained library is the pride of Mahatma Phule College. In the 21st century, with the advent of new courses and the need for new knowledge in every subject, the library has become a vital resource to ensure that students are equipped with the necessary skills and knowledge to succeed in today's competitive world. The library is fully equipped with reference books, textbooks, magazines, periodicals, and newspapers covering various subjects. Our library also has a vast repository of knowledge available to students.

Library-related instructions:

- 1. A library membership card is required to enter the library.
- 2. Reference books, course materials, questionnaires, magazines, newspapers, and periodicals are available for reference within the library premises and cannot be taken outside the library or borrowed.
- 3. All classes, including undergraduate and graduate students, must regularly visit the library.
- 4. The first three students of each class are provided from the library with due respect.
- 5. Books will not be issued on someone else's identification card or borrower's card.
- 6. Free book bank and other facilities for physically handicapped students.

Competitive Exam Guidance center:

Competitive exam guidance center has been operating in colleges since 1998-99. Under this center, guidance is provided to students for Maharashtra Public Service Commission, Central Public Service Commission, and banking exams. Regular lectures are conducted by professors and experts from various fields in order to provide appropriate guidance for the respective exams.

Forms for the Maharashtra Public Service Commission (MPSC) and the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) exams are sent to students through the college. The college library has relevant books available for the current competitive exams, and students can take advantage of them. In addition, the 'Karmaveer Vidya Prabodhini' conducts junior and senior college-level competitive exams, which can serve as a good practice for the MPSC and UPSC exams. Efforts are made to ensure that students get the most benefit from these exams.

In 2014, the college has constructed a building at M.I.D.C Plot No. G/P 191 in Chinchwad, which is a spacious and well-equipped examination center. More than 1,100 books are available at the location, which can be used for preparation for various competitive exams. Interested students can take interviews and select candidates for admission to the college. Expert and experienced guides in various fields will be available to provide lectures for competitive exams.

Entrepreneurship Development Cell:

This college not only aims to prepare students for jobs but also to encourage them to become self-employed and start their own businesses. To support this goal, our college has established a Business Guidance Center to provide inspiration and guidance to students. The center offers various resources such as guidance books, reference materials, regular publications, study tours, discussions, and lectures from experts and experienced professionals in respective fields. Workshops are also organized for students to develop the necessary skills and knowledge for entrepreneurship.

The Government of Maharashtra also provides business guidance services, and our college encourages students to take advantage of these services as well. By providing access to such resources and services, our college aims to support students in becoming successful entrepreneurs and contributing to the growth of the economy.

Department of Sports:

Sports are a highly important component of the college, and the Department of Sports is its soul. Through sports, students develop physical, mental, and intellectual capabilities. Additionally, sports promote values such as teamwork, discipline, leadership, and moral values. The Department of Sports is continuously engaged in promoting all of these qualities. Through participation in team and individual sports, students have achieved significant success at the intra-college, inter-departmental, inter-university, state and national levels. At the junior Asian judo competition held in Macau, Rohini Mohite emerged as the winner of the golden prize. Similarly, Abhishek Patil secured the bronze prize in the All India Intra University Weight Lifting Competition. Sapna Pande, Laxman Dervada, and Sandesh Bhosale participated in various intra-college competitions and emerged as winners in outdoor sports. Additionally, others also secured the second position in several other competitions.

Medical check-up and consultation center for students:

Every year, the university provides free medical check-up for students who have taken admission in the first year of courses such as B.A. B.Sc., B. Com. B.C.A. and B. Sc. This check-up is mandatory for students. In addition to this, the college provides medical check-up/consultation service to all students as per their requirement throughout the year. If any student has any health-related complaints within the campus, the college has arranged for free first aid services by Dr. Mahesh Mahajan near the Pimpri village bus stop.

National Service Scheme and N.C.C.:

To promote the all-round development of the personality of the youth and to build their social awareness, our college is actively involved in the National Service Scheme. Every year, the department conducts a seven-day labour camp. Students who complete two years of participation in the National Service Scheme and one labour camp are awarded 10 bonus points in their university exams. The college also has a National Cadet Corps (N.C.C.) unit that provides students with opportunities for leadership, discipline, and physical fitness.

Karmaveer Bhaurao Patil 'Earn and learn' scheme:

To avoid poor students from dropping out of school due to financial constraints and to provide them with quality education, Karmveer Bhaurao initiated the "Earn and Learn" program in the Rayat Shikshan Sanstha. This program provided a path to earning income through education. This program has also been implemented in our college, and eligible and deserving students are selected for it. By working for the college, these students can earn a suitable reward, which can be used to continue their higher education. Financial assistance is also available for this program from the university, so many students benefit from this program.

Women's Forum:

The situation of women is changing rapidly over time. As moral and social values change, what has happened in the world in response to these changes, and what challenges the new age presents and how to support them, the Women's Forum works actively to provide guidance and support to all students in terms of their responsibilities and duties. The Women's Forum conducts training and guidance throughout the year in colleges for the mental and intellectual development of female students. Special training programs are also organized under the Cultural Department. Many opportunities are available for students who can enrol in this college to develop their personality.

Internet facilities:

In the age of information technology, to make information quickly available to students, internet facilities have been made available in the college library and various departments. These facilities are provided to students and departments as per their requirements.

Suggestion Box:

To provide a platform for students to raise complaints, suggestion box have been installed in the library and in each wing. The complaints are reviewed by the concerned authorities and appropriate action is taken accordingly.

Short-term courses:

To impart at least three skills in three years to the students pursuing education in the college, various short-term courses are conducted. These courses are suitable for self-employment as well as for employment opportunities. Therefore, students should contact their department heads regarding admission to short-term courses related to their preferred or related subjects.

Placement Cell:

With the growth of industrial and information technology sectors at Pimpri-Chinchwad area, there is now an increasing demand for skilled human resources from various companies. Training programs are also organized to prepare the students for the interviews and various training programs are organized to help students choose suitable positions in reputed companies.

Information regarding college uniform:

Every student enrolled in the arts, commerce, and science branches of the college must wear the college uniform. The colour of the uniform is different for each branch. Detailed information about the uniform will be posted on the notice board of the college.

Identity Card:

It is necessary for every student who has enrolled in this college to have an identification card. Without the ID card, they will not be able to use the library or other facilities. To obtain an ID card, the student must pay the required fee at the library, and they will receive their ID card after payment. Upon receiving the ID card, the student must affix a passport-sized photograph to the card and fill in the necessary information and signatures. Previous year students should renew their ID cards within the given time frame. The ID card must be worn at all times while on the college premises. Failure to do so may result in disciplinary action.

Anti-Ragging:

After the Supreme Court directed to put an end to ragging, the University Grants Commission (UGC) has formulated regulations to prevent ragging. Every student and parent must sign a pledge stating that they will not engage in ragging. If any student is found involved in ragging, they will be penalized, including being expelled from all academic benefits for the entire academic year, withholding of scholarships, fellowships, or any other similar benefits, debarring from appearing in any test/examination, withholding of results, suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess, rustication from the institution, and imposing a fine of Rs. 25,000 to Rs. 1 lakh. The Anti-Ragging Committee is working actively in universities.

Tip: Admission to the university is only possible if a pledge on a Rs. 10 Bond stating that the student will not engage in ragging is signed, and if not signing, they will not be admitted.

Mobile phones:

Students are prohibited from carrying mobile phones to the classroom. It is a punishable offense under the law to carry mobile phones to class.

T.C. / L.C. / Bona fide:

To apply for a T.C. (Transfer Certificate), admission, or any other official work in Senior College or Junior College, students should submit a prescribed application along with required documents photocopies and pay the necessary fees between 10:30 am to 1:30 pm. After completing the T.C. / admission application process and submitting the necessary fees, it will be provided to the students on the third day (excluding holidays) between 3 pm to 5 pm.

While taking admission in the college, students are required to pay various types of fees as per the norms set by the Maharashtra Government's Education Department and the Pune University, which is recognized by the authorities. Detailed information regarding the fees is as below.

Information for all:

- 1. All students who are liable to pay the fees, must pay all fees at the time of admission.
- 2. Except for the tuition fee, no other fee will be refunded if admission is cancelled for any reason.
- 3. If admission is cancelled for any reason during the academic year, the student who is a scholarship holder or a fee concession holder will still have to pay the fees, which may be charged as arrears. No fee concession or scholarship will be given to a student who withdraws from the course after admission is cancelled.
- 4. Apart from the above fees, the University shall be free to charge fees for examinations, annual examinations, environment science examinations, etc.
- 5. Other fees will be charged as follows, in addition to regular fees.
- 6. All students who take admission will have to fill out the examination form at the same time, and it is mandatory for the students to appear for the examination at the time determined by the University.

Admission related information:

Once the results of the previous year are declared in this college, the admission process for the next year begins. To take admission, students have to fill out a prescribed admission form. After that, a list of selected candidates is displayed on the notice board and the students are given a specific time frame to take admission. During the admission process, all the rules and regulations of the government are considered. The children of ex-servicemen, disabled children, etc. are also given priority during the admission process. After submitting the admission form, it is important for the students to stay in touch with the admission committee until the admission process is completed. It is also necessary to regularly check the notice board for updates. Admission will not be given to students who fail to take admission within the given time frame.

Note: Fill out the admission form without any errors. After filling out the form, get it verified by the admission committee and then fill out the online admission form on the website http://mpcpune.rayatdc.com/MPC/. Take a printout of the online admission form along with all the necessary documents and get it verified by the college. On the same day, pay the admission fee to confirm your admission.

Rules for all the students taking admission in the college:

- 1. The admission fee once paid by the students will not be refunded for any reason.
- After taking admission in the college, if a student wants to cancel his/her admission from the college, and then he/she will have to pay the complete fee of the first semester.
- 3. The fee should be paid at the time mentioned in the information sheet.
- 4. The right to give admission in the college or not is reserved with the Principal.
- 5. For special subjects with limited seats, admission will be given based on merit.
- 6. It is mandatory to take the identification card after admission. Two passport-sized photos in postal ticket size should be submitted to the library for identification card.

1. First year of Arts, Science, Commerce and B.C.A. programs:

To take admission in the first year of degree, a Student must pass the state board's recognized H.S.C. examination or an examination equivalent to the same.

It is necessary for the students to fulfil the requirements mentioned in the application form while applying for admission. Here is the list of required documents:

- 1. Completely filled and accurate application form along with necessary information.
- 2. Original and photocopy of the leaving certificate from the school or college.
- 3. Eligibility form (completely filled) along with the fee of Rs. 100/- to be sent to the university.
- 4. Complete fee for the admission form along with the necessary documents.
- 5. Original mark sheet of the 12th standard with two photocopies.

2. Second and Third year of Arts, Science and Commerce:

To take admission in the second and third year of Arts, Science and Commerce programs, students must fulfil the following requirements:

- 1. The application form should be completely filled and accurate.
- 2. The previous examination mark sheet should be submitted for verification.
- 3. Complete fee for the admission form along with the necessary documents.

3. Students transferring to the college from any college under Savitribai Phule Pune University:

- 1. The application form should be completely filled and accurate.
- 2. The Transference Certificate (T.C.) provided by the previous college, until the submission of T.C. student's admission will be considered provisional.
- 3. The original and true copy of the previous exam's marksheet should be verified by the authorities.
- 4. The full fee should be paid according to the state application.
- 5. The certificate of the previous college's academic performance should be attached with the application.

4. Students transferring to the college from other than Savitribai Phule Pune University:

- 1. The admission application along with the information form should be completely and accurately filled in capital letters.
- 2. The original and true copies of the previous exam certificates should be attested.
- 3. The migration certificate from the university is necessary.
- 4. The eligibility form along with a fee of Rs. 100/- for students coming from other universities in the state and Rs. 200/- for students coming from universities outside the state should be submitted.
- 5. The entire fee should be paid as per the admission application fee schedule.
- 6. A certificate indicating the conduct of the previous university should be submitted.

The students who were enrolled in this college in the previous year should take admission within eight days from the declaration of results of the college's exams, along with completing all the necessary requirements.

Important note: For students of S.Y (B.A./B.Com./B.Sc.) programs, the Pune University has included the subject "Environment Awareness" in the curriculum, and every regular student must pass the examination and complete the project related to it in order to be eligible for a degree. Please make a note of this.

Physical Education Examination Scheme

(For all students who have taken admission in the first year of Arts, Commerce, Science and B.B.A)

All students who have taken admission in the first year of Arts, Commerce, Science and B.B.A are required to appear for the physical education examination in the second semester. The examination consists of two sections - Section A and Section B. Section A consists of Physical Fitness Test (80 marks) and Section B consists of Project Work (20 marks). A minimum of 32 marks in Section A and 8 marks in Section B are required to pass the examination. These marks will be converted into grades.

Thus, for TYBA, there are 1 required subject + 3 general subjects + 2 special subjects, total 6 subjects.

First-year students in the B.A. / B.Com./ B. Voc. program, as well as for the T.Y. B.A./B.Com. program, the internal assessment will carry a weightage of 20 marks and the annual examination will carry a weightage of 80 marks. However, for subjects that have a practical or oral exam, such as language subjects like Marathi/Hindi, a separate oral examination will be conducted, which will carry a weightage of 20 marks, while the annual examination will carry a weightage of 60 marks.

For students enrolled in the F.Y. B.Voc. program, who have opted for the Marathi/Hindi subject, an oral examination will be conducted in addition to the annual examination. The oral examination will carry a weightage of 10 marks, while the internal assessment and the annual examination will carry a weightage of 20 marks and 70 marks respectively.

- 1. It is mandatory for students to fill out the university's examination form for both internal and annual examinations.
- 2. Semester exams will be conducted for 60 marks and then that will converted to 20 marks.
- 3. Semester exam marks will not be included in the annual exam scorecard unless the annual exam form is filled out.
- 4. To pass a subject in the annual exam, a minimum of 32 marks out of 80 must be obtained.
- 5. If a student fails a subject with only 32 marks in the annual exam and does not take the semester exam, they will be allowed to take the semester exam in the following year.
- 6. If a student has obtained 32 marks out of 80 in the annual exam but has failed to pass the semester exam, they will have to take the semester exam in the following year. However, to include their semester exam marks, they must fill out the annual exam form and score a minimum of 32 out of 80.

The following are the guidelines for the semester terms in the university:

- 1. Every student must attend at least 80% of the working days during each term. Failure to do so will result in disqualification from filling out the examination form.
- 2. All first-year students in Arts, Science, Commerce, and Post-graduate courses must undergo a medical examination as per university regulations. Those who do not undergo the medical examination will not be allowed to fill out the examination form.
- 3. Every student must attend seminars, essay writing, paper reading, and participate in college and national events from time to time. Such activities are essential for the overall progress and development of students. If students behaviour and progress is satisfactory, the principal of the college can forward application to the university only after due verification. The right to send the examination form to the university lies with the principal according to rules and regulations of the university. Principal's decision will be final, and no complaints will be entertained. The students who comply with these rules are eligible to appear for the examination.

Rules and Regulations for Student Behaviour:

- 1. Each student must attend all their classes on time and follow the rules regarding attendance. If a student is present for all classes, their attendance will be recorded.
- 2. Students must complete all tutorials for each subject within the given time frame.
- 3. If a student's attendance is below 80% and behaviour is not satisfactory, they may lose their scholarship or other benefits. The college will not be responsible for any loss of benefits due to such reasons.
- 4. After admission to the college, students must carry their ID card with them at all times. The college authorities, including the principal, teachers, clerks, and security personnel, may ask to see it at any time.
- 5. It is important for students to read the notices displayed on the college notice board as well as on the college website from time to time. Failure to read these notices will not exempt students from the academic, financial, or any other consequences that may result from their actions. All students should take note of this.
- 6. No student should create any disturbance in the college premises during class hours. Any student found to be creating a disturbance during class will be held responsible for their actions, both individually and as a group.
- 7. Students should wear clean and tidy uniforms.
- 8. A student should not behave in a way that might create problem within or outside college premises.
- 9. Any information or communication related to the college or the institution should not be given in newspapers or elsewhere, for publicity purpose without the prior permission of the principal.
- 10. Every student must take responsibility for maintaining silence in the classroom, laboratory, library, office, and hostel as well as during events.
- 11. The principal, faculty, and staff provide oral or written instructions and notices regarding the college's activities and discipline, and students must be aware of them.
- 12. Students should speak with humility and kindness while speaking with professors and office staff while addressing their concerns or questions they may have.

- 13. If a student's behaviour is detrimental to the interests of the educational institution or university, and if the opinions of the authorities are such, the student may be expelled from the University for no Reason.
- 14. Damaging college buildings, windows, doors, furniture, or any other kind of property, as well as engaging in any behaviour that causes loss to the college, will result in disciplinary action.
- 15. According to university regulations, the authorities have the right to modify, correct, cancel, or introduce new rules, as well as make significant decisions related to academics.
- 16. Students whose behaviour is not according to the code of conduct will be not be allowed to take admission in next year of their degree courses.
- 17. As per the resolution no. 46, dated 01/06/1991 of the Higher Education Committee of Rayat Shikshan Sanstha, the college's annual gatherings have been cancelled. Therefore, the selection of the General Secretary (G.S.), student representatives (L.R.), and Junior College class representatives will not take place.
- 18. Students should not bring valuable items with them.
- 19. Students must park their bicycles, scooters, etc. at the designated parking area and college does not take any responsibility regarding this.
- 20. Without the principal's permission, no notices or flyers may be posted on notice boards.
- 21. Students must pay all fees before the deadline.
- 22. Students should keep a copy of their fee receipt safe and ensure that they have it readily available if needed.
- 23. The original documents submitted at the time of admission will not be issued for any reason.
- 24. Before filling out the examination form, students must complete formalities regarding books, fees and fines with the college.
- 25. According to letter no. F 1-8/2006 (PP-I) dated March 4, 2008 from Hon. Secretary, the UGC, New Delhi, and 'The Gazette of India' dated July 4, 2009, as well as the results provided by the Honourable Supreme Court, New Delhi in SLP (C) 24295/2004, it is mandatory to inform all students that ragging is strictly prohibited and any complaints related to it will result in disciplinary action by the concerned university.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

At the time of admission, each student must sign a statement accepting 'The Code of Conduct' and giving an undertaking that he/ will abide by the rules, regulations, code of ethics and conduct laid down by the Management of the College.

1. He/she should be regular and must complete her/his studies in the institute. It is required that the student maintains adequate attendance for her/him to stand eligible to appear for examination.

If a student is forced to discontinue studies for any legitimate reason, such a student may be relived from the institute subject to written consent of the Principal. The student will be relieved only after clearing all pending dues. If a student had joined the institute on a scholarship, the said grant shall be revoked.

2. The institute believes in promoting a safe and efficient environment for learning so as to nurture the youth of the nation to become responsible citizens of India. All students must uphold academic integrity, respect all persons and their rights, property and safety of others, etc.

Academic Integrity encompasses honesty and responsibility and awareness relating to ethical standards for the conduct of research and scholarship. The Institute believes that in all academic work, the ideas and contributions of others must be appropriately acknowledged. Academic integrity is essential for the success of the individual and of institute and hence, violations of academic integrity constitute a serious offence.

The principles of academic integrity require that a student:

- Properly acknowledges and cites use of the ideas, results, material or words of others.
- Properly acknowledges all contributors to a given piece o work.
- Makes sure that all work submitted as his/her own in a course or other academic activity is produced without the aid of impermissible materials or impermissible collaboration.
- Obtains all data or results by ethical means and reports them accurately without suppressing any results inconsistent with his or her interpretation or conclusions.
- Treats all other students in an ethical manner, respecting their integrity and right to pursue their educational goals without interference. This requires that a student neither facilitates academic dishonesty by others nor obstructs their academic progress.

Violations of this policy include, but are not limited to:

(i) Plagiarism means the use of the material, ideas, figures, code or data as one's own, without appropriately acknowledging the original source. This may involve submission of material, verbatim or paraphrased, that is authored by another person or published earlier by oneself.

Examples of plagiarism include:

- a) Reproducing, in whole or part, text/sentences from a report, book, thesis, publication or the internet.
- (b) Reproducing one's own previously published data, illustrations, figures, images, or someone else's data, etc.

- (c) Taking material from class-notes or incorporating material from the internet graphs, drawing, photographs, diagrams, tables, spreadsheets, computer programs, or other non-textual material from other sources into one's class reports, presentations, manuscripts, research papers or thesis without proper attribution.
- (d) Self plagiarism which constitutes copying verbatim from one's own earlier published work in a journal or conference proceedings without appropriate citations.
- (e) Submitting a purchased or downloaded term paper or other materials to satisfy a course requirement.
- (f) Paraphrasing or changing an author's words or style without citation.

(ii) Cheating - Cheating includes, but is not limited to.

- (a) Copying during examinations, and copying of homework assignments, term papers, thesis or manuscripts.
- (b) Allowing or facilitating copying, or writing a report or taking examination for someone else.
- (c) Using unauthorized material, copying, collaborating when not authorized and purchasing or borrowing papers or material from various sources.
- (d) Fabricating (making up) or falsifying (manipulating) data and reporting them in thesis and publications.
- (e) Creating sources, or citations that do not exist.
- (f) Altering previously evaluated and re-submitting the work in re-evaluation.
- (g) Signing another student's name on an assignment, report, research paper, thesis or attendance sheet.
- 3. All students must deter from indulging in any and all forms of misconduct including partaking in any activity which has potential to damage his/her own wellbeing and/or affect the institute's interests and reputation substantially. The various forms of misconduct include:
- i) Unable to produce the identity card, issued by the Institute, or refusing to produce it on demand by campus security guards.
- ii) Intentionally damaging or destroying Institute property or property of other students and/or faculty members.
- iii) Any disruptive activity in a class room or in an event sponsored by the Institute.
- iv) Any act of discrimination (physical or verbal conduct) based on an individual's gender, caste, race, religion or religious belief, colour, region, language, disability, or sexual orientation, marital or family status, physical or mental disability, gender identity, etc.
- v) Indulging in any form of harassment which is defined as a conduct that is severe and objectively, a conduct that is motivated on the basis of person's race, colour, national or ethnic origin, citizenship, sex, religion, age sexual orientation, gender, gender identity, marital status, ancestry, physical or mental disability, medical condition, etc.
- 4. Students should refrain from theft or unauthorized access to others resources.
- 5. Students should not engage in disorderly. lewd, or indecent conduct, including, but not limited to, creating unreasonable noise, pushing and shoving, inciting or participating in a riot or group disruption.

- 6. Student should no misbehave during any study tour / fest / fresher's party / farewell party / intercollegiate competitions / other activity at the college.
- 7. Parking a vehicle in a no parking zone or in area earmarked for parking other type of vehicles should be avoided. Also, rash driving on / near the campus that may cause any inconvenience to others should be avoided.
- 8. Smoking on the campus of the Institute is strictly prohibited. Possessing, consuming distributing, selling of alcohol / any intoxicating agent in the college is strictly prohibited.
- 9. The students should not indulge in unauthorized possession, carrying or use of any weapon, ammunition, explosives, or potential weapons, fireworks, contrary to law or policy. Unauthorized possession or use of harmful chemicals and harmed drugs is strictly prohibited.
- 10. Participating in activities including organizing meeting and processions without permission from the authorities of the college is strictly prohibited. The students should not accept membership of religions or terrorist groups banned by the Institute / Government of India.
- 11. Students are expected not to interact, on behalf of the Institute, with media representatives or invite media persons on to the campus without the permission of the college authorities.
- 12. Students are not permitted to provide audio and video clippings of any activity on the campus to media without prior permission.
- 13. Students are not permitted to either audio or video record lectures in class rooms or actions of other students, faculty, or staff without prior permission.
- 14. Students are expected to use the social media carefully and responsibly. They cannot post derogatory comments about other individuals from the Institute on the social media or indulge in any such related activities having grave ramifications on the reputation of the Institute.

If there is a case against a student for possible breach of code of conduct, it will be addressed by the existing discipline committee / anti ragging committee / gender issue cell / sexual harassment redressal cell; whichever is applicable.

The committee may meet the student to ascertain the misconduct and suggest one or more of the following disciplinary actions based on the nature of misconduct. The Head of the Institution will hold all rights to take suitable disciplinary action.

Disciplinary actions may include one or more of the following actions based on the nature of misconduct.

WARNING: A warning will be given to the student, which will indicate that the action of the said delinquent student was in violation of the Code of Conduct and any further acts of misconduct shall result in severe disciplinary action.

RESTRICTIONS: The student may be reprimanded and access to various facilities on the campus may be restricted for specified period of time.

COMMUNITY SERVICE: The student will be required to provide community service for a specified period of time, which may be extended if, need be. However, any future misconduct along with failure to comply with any conditions imposed may lead to severe disciplinary action, including suspension or expulsion.

EXPULSION: The student may be expelled from the college permanently. This will indicate prohibition from entering the Institute premises or participating in any student related activities or events on campus etc.

MONETARY PENALTY: The student may be penalized in monetary terms. This may also include suspension or forfeiture of scholarship / fellowship for specific time period.

SUSPENSION: The student may be suspended for a specified period of time which will entail prohibition on participating in student related activities, classes, programs etc. Additionally, the student will be forbidden to use various Institute facilities unless permission is obtained from the Competent Authority. Suspension may also follow by possible dismissal, along with the following additional penalties.

- Ineligibility to reapply for admission to the Institute for a period of three years.
- Withholding the grade card or certificate for the courses studied or work carried out.

Appeal to the Parents of Students:

We appeal to the parents of students who have taken admission in this college to be vigilant about their wards' studies and behaviour. The college tries to keep the parents informed about their wards' attendance in class, performance in exams, and overall conduct, but we especially request the parents to be more involved in the following matters:

- 1. Please pay attention to the time when you receive your ward's exam results. If you do not receive them on time, please inquire about it. It is important to ensure that your ward's academic progress is being monitored.
- 2. It is necessary for your ward to be present for various internal and external examinations conducted by the university.
- 3. Parents should also attend parent-teacher meetings to stay informed about their ward's progress. Information about these meetings will be communicated to parents through the students.
- 4. If you receive any correspondence from the college regarding your ward's behaviour, please take it seriously. In such situations, it is necessary for the parents to meet the authorities in person.
- 5. Due to busy schedules, many a times parents don't get updates on their wards academic progress. In terms of the grades or behaviour he may get lost during the degree programs, the college may need to come up with a plan at some point to address this. In all situations, parents may have concerns about their child's behaviour, and may want to stay in touch with the principal and teachers. Otherwise, the college will not be responsible for any academic losses suffered by the students.
- 6. Students, parents, and teachers are the three important components of the education system. Therefore, parents should cooperate with the college, the principal, and other officials to ensure proper education.

Scholarship Scheme:

1. Special Scholarship Scheme:

Former Chief Minister of Maharashtra and President of Rayat Shikshan Sanstha, Hon Padma Vibhushan Sharadchandraji Pawar, had given a sum of Rs. 5,00,000/- (Five lakh rupees only) from the Chief Minister Fund for the purpose of providing scholarship for 6 girls and 4 boys during the naming ceremony of this college. Scholarships are provided from the interest on that fund. The selection process for the scholarship will be announced from time to time.

The following scholarships are currently available:

Students who have given their examination and obtained a minimum of 55% marks can apply for these scholarships. The application forms are available at the college office at the start of the year.

Eligibility for Scholarships:

- 1. The student must be studying in the college to be eligible for the scholarship.
- 2. The student should have passed the previous examination in the first attempt with a minimum of 55% marks. (There shouldn't be backlog in the course).
- 3. The student should be in financial need.
- 4. The student should have good conduct and character.
- 5. If the student has expertise in art, sports, or cultural programs, it will be given priority.
- 6. A certificate from other authorized officials may also be required along with the application.

Duration of scholarship:

Scholarships are given to students for respective academic year only.

Rules about scholarships:

The final decision of the Principal of the college is applicable to all scholarships. The college has the authority to change the rules and regulations of the scholarship.

- 2. Savitribai Phule Scholarship Scheme of Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune provides up to Rs. 5000/- scholarships to 15 students each year from economically disadvantaged backgrounds.
- 3. Various other scholarships and fee waivers are available to students such as the Maharashtra government's *Eklavya* Financial Assistance Scheme and the Shahu Maharaj Quality Scholarship Scheme.
- 4. The minority Matriculation Scholarship Scheme, which is provided by the Higher and Technical Education Department of the Maharashtra State, is available to students belonging to minority communities.
